Content, But Lost

Content is defined by Webster as "happy with what one has or is; not wanting anything else; satisfied." Considered by many as one of the worst possible things you could do would be to upset someone's contented and satisfied condition. I mean, here you have a person that is perfectly content with who he is and what he has, and then someone comes along and throws a stick of dynamite into such a peaceful situation. What nerve! Who could imagine such gall as to rock the boat, challenge the status quo, upsetting the apple cart of satisfaction?

The fact of the matter is that Jesus did this very thing when He arrived on the satisfied Jewish scene nearly 2000 years ago. He faced a religiously zealous people who were content with their brand of religion. The problem was that their religious standard was not the standard of God. They were ignorant of God's standard of righteousness and therefore had not submitted themselves unto God's system (Romans 10:1-3).

The intellectual giants of Athens were given to the idolatry of heathenism (Acts 17:16ff). They were content with their brand of religion. Paul challenged their contentedness with the gospel message which would completely do away with the very source of their satisfaction, their superstitious reliance on the supposed wisdom of mere man. Paul not only rocked their contented boat with the truth; he capsized it.

Our world today, this valley, the city of Dunlap is filled with religiously content people. Many are zealous and satisfied with the religious brand of which they are a part. The false idea that you should not disturb a satisfied person in the religion of his contented state is a blatant lie which delights the devil. Multiplied millions are content with religion begun by men that offers no salvation nor peace with God. Still others, having a degree of the understanding of truth, are satisfied to dabble at Christianity, play church, and deceive themselves into contentment while never really seeking first the kingdom of God and His righteousness at all (Matthew 6:33).

The point I hope we can see is this: contented is not equal to converted, and satisfaction is not the same as salvation. When people live contented, satisfied lives and yet die lost, who do you suppose ought to be disturbing them? When Paul saw the city of Athens "wholly given to idolatry" his "spirit was stirred in him." Does satisfied souls being lost stir your spirit?
