

Obstacle Courses

One of the most popular television sporting events a few years ago was billed a "Superstar Competition." Athletes from various sports competed against each other to see who was the best athlete over all. I can still see in my mind boxer Joe Frazier nearly drowning as he tried his expertise at swimming. It was a very entertaining competition but the climax of all the events was the obstacle course. This is where the champion would be crowned and the rest eliminated. I always wanted to try this final event and see if I could at least finish without having to call 911. Did you? Here you could see folks pushing themselves to the very limit.

It may be that the reason for the appeal of this event above others is that life itself is so much like an obstacle course and everyone is competing, either successfully or unsuccessfully. There are heavy weights that must be pushed aside and there are walls that must be climbed over. Speed is good but consistency and perseverance are essential. The same is true in the obstacle course we call life (Revelation 2:10; Galatians 6:9). The contestant who is indifferent in his approach will not finish successfuly. It's the same with life (Romans 12:11; Titus 2:14; Revelation 3: 14-22). The person who begins the course but doesn't stay on it will not receive the prize. That is true after having started the course of Christianity too (II Timothy 2:5; Hebrews 12:1,2; II Timothy 4:7,8).

There are many obstacles we face in the race of life, but many can be avoided. It is a wise competitor indeed who can see the unnecessary obstacles and avoid them. Anything that would impede our progress toward the goal of heaven must be removed. No one can compete for us. We will have to give account of our own selves as to how we have done (II Corinthians 5:10). Let us therefore run with patience the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith (Hebrews 12:2).
