Thanksgiving

"Rejoice in the Lord alway: and again I say, Rejoice. Let your moderation be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand. Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:4-7

It is not only when things are going well that Christians are to rejoice, but always, even in times of our greatest adversities. After being severely beaten by the leaders of the Jews, Peter and John "...departed from the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for his name" (Acts 5:41).

One of the most difficult temptations for Christians in our generation is the temptation to worry to a degree far out of proportion to reality. These verses challenge us not simply to believe in God, but to learn to trust him so much that we can rejoice even when everything around us seems hopeless. Such conviction can change our whole attitude toward fear, persecution, and even death.

One of the great principles of the Bible is that... "As Faith Increases, Worry Decreases." Paul, who spent considerable time in prisons, could say, "I have learned in whatsoever state I am, therewith to be content" (Philippians 4:11). This conviction does not come easily and must be "learned" over a period of time. Paul had many opportunities (II Corinthians 1:8,9; Acts 19:22-41; II Corinthians 11:23-28). No problem is too great or too small; the God who knows even the sparrow's fall is never overburdened by our petitions. "Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you" (I Peter 5:7).

The peace of mind which allowed the early Christians to sing hymns as they were about to be devoured by lions has never been understood by the world, for it comes only through a deep dedication to God and a clear trust in His Word (John 14:27).

A day of thanksgiving? What about a life of thanksgiving? With the recognition of Him from Whom all blessings flow (James 1:17) how could we be anything but grateful and thankful? Would that not also mean we are under obligation? Thankfully so. "...God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, being now justified by his blood, we shall be saved from wrath through him" (Romans 5:8,9).
