The Center Is Christ

The Lord's church exploded onto the scene of Jerusalem about 33 A.D. as recorded in Acts 2 and experienced phenomenal growth by anyone's standards. 3,000 were added on Pentecost day (Acts 2:41). The sudden surge of the new faith disturbed the status quo and brought opposition from Jewish leaders in Jerusalem. They thought that killing Jesus would kill the movement, but Jesus rose from the dead and that which He began did not die. It grew, filling the streets of Jerusalem, and they were "continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, did eat their meat with gladness and singelness of heart, Praising God, and having favour with all the people, and the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved," (Acts 2:46,47).

They could not be stopped. Just as Christ promised (Acts 1:8) they spread from Jerusalem throughout Judaea and Samaria, then across Asia Minor, Macedonia, Greece, Italy, all the way to Rome, the political center of paganism. The number of enemies grew trying to impede its progress, threatening, stoning, and killing its proclaimers, but nothing could stop it

Christianity survives because of the strength of its center, Christ. Not philosophy, or human tradition, or man's wisdom, but Jesus Christ and Him crucified. Paul wrote to the Corinthians that first, last, and at all points in between, apostolic preaching is Jesus Christ, (I Corinthians 2:2). There's strength. Stability and resilience, our impulse for growth comes from the center out. We keep on keeping on because our message is the same as that taught, accepted, lived and defended by first century Christians.

If we want what they had we must abide by that which they abided. "For the Jews require a sign, and the Greeks seek after wisdom: But we preach Christ crucified, unto the Jews a stumblingblock, and unto the Greeks foolishness," (I Corinthians 1:22,23).
