How Did He Die (Live)?


It seems that there is a morbid part of man that causes him to be more interested in how people die than in how they live. When we see a funeral procession, the first question usually asked is, "Whose funeral is it?" Then the second question follows, "How did he die?"

I recently mentioned to a friend on a given occasion that I had a funeral to preach within a few minutes. He asked, "Whose funeral is it?" I told him. Then he asked a very unusual question: "How did he live?"

All the way through the funeral that question kept coming to my mind. It is far more important how people live than how they die. There are a thousand and one different ways to die.

As we stand before God on Judgment Day, the supreme question will not be, "How did you die?" Rather, it will be, "How did you live?" "The Lord has no pleasure in the death of the wicked" (Ezekiel 33:11), but "precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints" (Psalm 116:15).
