Dare To Be Different

With obvious consistency, the Scriptures teach that the people of God are to be different from the world. It has always been that way and will continue to be so. In talking this week with one of our good sisters, she informed me of a conversation she had with a fellow employee in discussing the subject of modest apparel. Shock and amazement are the norm when God's people simply turn to the Bible and seek to follow the guidelines God has given for that purpose.

Paul beseched the Roman Christians, and thus Christians today by this principle, "...be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God." Romans 12:2. Paul's inspired injunction in II Corinthians 6:17 rings as true today as when originally penned, "Come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord...". Who has difficulty understanding James 4:4, "...know ye not that the friendship of the world is enmity with God? whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God." Separation of God's people, the followers of Christ, Christians, members of the Lord's church, is a prominent theme in the New Testament (John 17:15,16; I John 2:15-17; II Peter 1:4; etc.). Who would honestly deny it? Few would in word, but in action, multitudes do.

Could it be that this concern of God is due to the pull of the world, the alluring qualities of worldliness and materialism? It is a constant battle to keep the world out of the church. The pressures of worldly influence are strong in our lives, but they were in the first century as well. It is a battle that must be waged by every faithful soldier of the cross individually and by every faithful congregation collectively. In many quarters, the battle was not even entered and, due to the failure to take a distinctive, God honoring stand, there is little, if any difference between those claiming to be Christians and the world from which they were supposedly called out.

When worldly things are prioritized, they become the consuming focus. When appealing to the world is desired above God's approval, worldliness has won out as souls are sacrificed. Be not deceived. You reap what you sow. It is, more often than not, a bitter harvest (Galatians 6:7-9). Think about it!
