A "Piece Of Protoplasm" (?)

As we are busily embarking upon various projects with many different degrees of importance, let us not forget those who depend upon us as their only voice. Will you speak for those who cannot? I refer to the current debate relative to stem cell research where misinformation and plain old lies are the norm for a crowd of folks claiming concern for life while betraying that anguish for those who must perish in order to accomplish their desires.

Recently in an article in *Newsweek* a proponent of harvesting stem cells from human embryos referred to them as a "piece of protoplasm." What he could not and cannot do with this callous comment is deny the humanity of the life he sees no problem in killing for his own selfish purposes. Even science has to admit that if allowed to nurture in his mother's womb for nine months, this "piece" of humanity could live until old age and die a natural death. While we express sympathy to those suffering with life-threatening illnesses, whom do they think they are in saying their lives are more precious than those of the tiny human beings whose advocates are their only voices. Adult stem cells and umbilical cords are the only ethical way to go.

Interestingly, in a letter to the editor concerning that article, a hospice nurse by the name of Margaret Terranova made these observations.

"I have learned that most of our choices regarding modern science and medicine are rooted in the notion that in the United States we simply must live longer. We expect science to cure every health problem. But demanding that everything be fixed allows us to wear blinders as we step on a rather dangerous path. I attended several sessions on stem-cell research conducted by a medical ethicist and asked what would be wrong with using existing fetal tissue that would be destroyed anyway. Her answer was to ask what researchers would do if that tissue showed promising results. The answer was simple: create more. Suddenly that slope looked very slippery."

There you have the whole matter boiled down as the black and white issue it really is. If these matters are not of concern to us, they better get to be that way! Why? "Hands that shed innocent blood" are an abomination to God (Proverbs 6:16-17). I dare say that we should view this matter as does God. What about you?
