## The Goal Of Love

The happiest congregations I know are composed of members who radiate cheerfulness, kindness, and understanding. There is an atmosphere of love among them that is evident even to strangers. It is not a superficially manufactured external either. It runs deeply in their veins. To them, love is not some rare gem to be stored and hidden in a vault of selfishness. Rather, it is the goal of their lives which are not aimed in getting but in giving.

The work of promoting such happiness in congregations was begun by the apostles of Christ. They trained others to maintain this noble task. Paul instructed Timothy about his primary work in the church in Ephesus: **"The goal of this command is love, which comes from a pure heart, a good conscience and a sincere faith"** (1 Timothy 1:5).

The goal was love, but Paul knew that the achievement of this aim required the proper atmosphere. He mentions that he has given Timothy a "command" or order and that the goal of "this command" was love. What command? The one previously mentioned by Paul in verses 3 and 4: **"As I urged you when I went into Macedonia, stay then in Ephesus so that you may command certain men not to teach false doctrines any longer... These promote controversies rather than God's work - which is by faith."** The end or goal of this command is to oppose doctrines which were a contradiction of the Word of God was love. Therefore we conclude that **love cannot be obtained in the presence of false doctrine!** Only when the Bible is taught and respected can true love grow. Factions and controversies are the result of false teachers and they must bear their blame

William Barclay translates verse 5: "This order of mine has no other object than to promote the love which issues from a clean heart, a good conscience and a sincere and genuine faith." The goal of love is promoted by the persons who keep their hearts pure, who live truly so that their alert and sensitive consciences approve their deeds measured by the standard of the Word of God. And it produces a sincere and genuine faith in those who believe and obey it.

Paul says this is the way to have a happy loving congregation. It is to be the worthy goal of every child of God.
