Obviously we can use the power of the vote to help the situation, just as Paul used his rights as a Roman citizen to help his situation (Acts 22:25-29). Yet you will find that is not the most that we can do as it pertains to our direct involvement. The things that people support now are what come from their hearts, for this is from where people's sinful actions come (Matt.15:18-19). Therefore, if we wish to end the trend of our nation, we must change the hearts of our nation.

The hopes of a nation do not ultimately rest in any political organization or party. The future of our nation does not rest in the Constitution, for any law made by man can be ignored by man. If men will ignore the laws of God, how can we expect any less as it pertains to the laws of men? In the end, the best way to improve the future of our nation is by bringing people into Christ's kingdom. This faith in Christ "cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Romans 10:17). Instead of being content to see others as the enemies of Christ, we must see these enemies of truth as souls desperately in need of Jesus. We still have a job to do, and not matter what happens to our country, nations rise and fall, but "the word of the Lord endureth for ever" (I Peter 1:25). For if God be for us, who can be against us" (Romans 8:31)?
