- 5:21 ~ "Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not kill; and whosoever shall kill shall be in danger of the judgment."
- 5:27-28 ~ "Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not commit adultery; <sup>(28)</sup>but I say unto you...."
- 5:31-32 ~ "It hath been said, Whosoever shall put away his wife, let him give her a writing of divorcement: (32) But I say unto you...."
- 5:38-39 ~ "Ye have heard that it hath been said, An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth: (39) But I say unto you...."
- 5:43-45 ~ "Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy (44) But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you; (45) That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust."
