Introduction

- 1. Matthew now looks at the life of Christ about 30 years later.
 - a. In Luke 3 we note the 15th year of Tiberius.
 - b. This would be about 28 years after events in Matthew 2.
- 2. John the baptizer, the forerunner of Christ and his message.
 - a. Relationship between John and Jesus.
 - b. "He must increase, but I must decrease" (John 3:30).
- 3. Jesus was baptized by John for an excellent purpose.
- 4. God speaks from heaven "this is my beloved Son..."



Select Verses

- 3:1-2 "In those days came John the Baptist, preaching in the wilderness of Judaea, ⁽²⁾ And saying, Repent ye: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."
- 3:8 "Bring forth therefore fruits meet for repentance:"
- 3:11 "I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance: but he that cometh after me is mightier than I, whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire."
- 3:13 ~ "Then cometh Jesus from Galilee to Jordan unto John, to be baptized of him."
- 3:15 ~ "And Jesus answering said unto him, Suffer it to be so now: for thus it becometh us to fulfil all righteousness. Then he suffered him."
- 3:17 ~ "And lo a voice from heaven, saying, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."
